

From the Superintendent: "IS YOUR GOD TOO SMALL?



J.B. Phillips, in his book, Your God Is Too Small observes, "No one is ever really at ease in facing what we call life and death without a religious faith. The trouble with many people is that they have not found a God big enough for modern needs." Many of us are still carrying around a nine or ten year old concept of God along with our adult understanding of history, science, and ourselves.

The reality is that we must have an adequate concept of God, if we are going to try and live in this modern world as Christians and have a strong and relevant faith. We must have a God big enough who can demand and capture our minds, our hearts and our lives; and can command our devotion and our commitment.

How do you know if your God is too small? If you see God as only a help in time of trouble and you only use him in times of emergencies or crisis, then your God is too small. If you worship a God who is your passport to heaven, and is not involved in your daily life, then your God is too small. If you see God as a badge of moral respectability and that you want to wear on your tee shirt or around your neck on a chain, then your God is too small. If you worship your grandmother's, mother's or father's God, that is just a hand-me-down God and you want a family heirloom God, then your God is too small. If you see your God just as a giver of all good gifts, and you don't know what you will do if you don't get what you want, then you need a heavenly Santa Claus or a Comic Bellhop, then your God is too small.

When I think of my concept of God, I'm reminded of an old gospel song entitled "He's Everything to Me." I think that I always believed that there was a God. In the stars I saw His handy work and in the wind He spoke with majesty. I was not surprised when I heard that He ruled over the land and sea, but I didn't know what that should mean to me. I was okay with celebrating the nativity because it had a place in history, and sure He came to set His children free, but what should that mean to me. And then, "One day by faith I met him face to face and felt the wonder of His grace. And then I knew that He was more than a God who didn't care, that lives way out there. Now he walks beside me day by day ever watching over me unless I stray, helping me to find a narrow way, He's everything to me."

If your God is too small I would like to introduce you to the God described in Psalm 139:1-6 which say: O Lord, you have examined my heart and know everything about me. You now when I sit down or stand up. You know my thoughts even when I'm far away. You see me when I travel and when I rest at home. You know everything I do. You know what I am going to say even before I say it Lord. You go before me and follow me. You place your hand of blessing on my head. Such knowledge is too wonderful for me, too great for me to understand!

God is all-seeing, all-knowing, all-powerful, and everywhere present. God knows us, God is with us, and his greatest gift is to allow us to know him.


What's a celebration without a picnic? There were lots of hot dogs, sloppy joes and of course cake. This day celebrated the Church coming together in brotherly love!
