

### From the Superintendent: PENTECOST



"For the promise is to you and to your children and to all that are far off" (Acts 2:39)

The apostle Peter spoke these words on the first Christian Pentecost. He was revealing the significance of the coming of the promised Holy Spirit. He also reminded them that the prophet Joel had prophesied this event many years before it happened: "In the last days, God says; "I will pour out my spirit upon all people. Your sons and daughters will prophesy. Your young men will see visions, and

your old men will dream dreams. In those days I will pour out my spirit even on my servants--men and women alike-and they will prophesy." (Acts 2: 17-18)

As we Christians from around the world unite to celebrate the birth of the Church we should remember these words of encouragement and the fulfillment of a divine promise made to us by Jesus. Remembering Pentecost should direct us back to the source of power, to the Holy Spirit, the Lord and Giver of life.

I truly believe that the Church, as well as, the world needs a new Pentecost. The world is on edge because of anxieties, suspicions, anger and hatred. Nations are putting their trust in the development of more diabolical weapons of destruction. Science continues to unveil new possibilities for human progress but the spiritual controls and influences needed to guide them to the right goals are sorely lacking. Antichristian forces are more organized and increasing at a rapid pace.

Many of our churches are becoming full of nominal or lukewarm members whose real god is their own success and happiness. Being spiritual but not religious (SBNR) is becoming the rule of the day. Religiosity has become popular but much of it caters only to the self-centered desire of unregenerate human nature. People are willing to accept Christ only if He accepts their life styles, on their conditions but refuse to submit to the complete reconstruction of the life He demands.

The disunity within Christendom has diluted our witness to the secular world and to non-christians. If we are to fulfill our mission in the world we must once more face the world as a Spirit-empowered, united, and evangelizing fellowship. A spiritual rebirth is the basic prerequisite for the unity of the church, as well as, for the vitalization of the church's witness. It is the renewal of hearts and minds by the Spirit of Him who says, "Behold I make all things new." Remember the promise still stands: "You shall receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you." The Lord of the church is ready to manifest His living presence, to change lives, to bind the hearts of believers together in love, and to empower them to effective witness. In sincere penitence and confident faith let all who call upon the name of Christ unite in praying: "Come, Holy Spirit!"
