


From the Superintendent: A HOLY CALLING



What does it mean to say that we are called of God? What does it mean to say that we have a ministry, lay and clergy? The Scriptures tells us "For God saved us and called us to live a Holy Life. He did this, not because we deserved it, but because that was His plan from before the beginning of time--to show us his grace through Christ Jesus." (2 Timothy 1:9) A calling is a special job God gives us. Every believer has a calling to serve Jesus Christ in God's Kingdom. God has a calling for each of us. When we are trying to accomplish what God has given us to do. We discover that God is working through us. God may not give you a calling out of a burning bush, but He surely speaks to your heart. And be assured that God will never ask you to live out someone else's calling or to achieve with someone else's gifts. We are to

respond to the calling we have and to invest in life with the gifts we have.

Our call is by grace. Our call has nothing to do with what we have accomplished. It is by grace that you are saved, not by works; it is the gift of God. We are called, not because we have greater gifts than anyone else or we are more privileged than anyone else. We are called through the grace of God. God has called us according to His presence, not according to our works, what we've done or left undone. We have ministry together.

Our calling is to Christ's power. One of the evidences of our calling is that Christ has given us the power to do something. The spirit of fear and powerlessness is replaced with the spirit of power. God has given us something to do, not everything; a place to be, not everywhere; and God has given us gifts to give.

Our calling is also to a spirit of love. If we have a spirit only of power it is not enough. The spirit of power must be tempered with a spirit of love. We are called to love other as ourselves.

Our calling is a "High" calling. (Phil. 3:14) Our calling is unchangeable. (Rom. 11:2)

Christ has chosen us to be His representatives on earth. In light of this truth, the Apostle Paul challenges us to live lives worthy of the calling we have received--the awesome privilege of being called Christ's very own. This includes being humble, gentle, patient, understanding, and peaceful. People are watching our live. Can they see Christ in you? How well are you doing as His representative? (Eph. 4:1-8)
